Summer Camp Descriptions 2024

Below you will find a brief description of each camp. Breakfast & Lunch will be provided at most sites except for: ALL Light House sites, and Eco Trowbridge. Most camps will participate in some type of STEM activity. Please check individual camp schedules for changes. Dress in comfortable clothing - shorts or pants, a T-shirt and sneakers are mandatory. For Safety: No open-toed shoes are permitted (flip-flops, Crocs, sandals, etc. Sunscreen, insect repellant and water shoes are recommended. Your child should bring a refillable water bottle, bathing suit, swim cap and towel to camp every day.

<u>TINY TOT CAMPS (ages 5 – 7):</u> these camps are specifically dedicated to our younger campers. They will be able to participate in age-appropriate sports and activities that will include field trips, hiking, arts and crafts, swimming and going to area playgrounds/splash pads.

Shore Program Campers spend their day exploring the Long Island Sound coastline, searching for prehistoric horseshoe crabs, discovering oysters and mussels in their natural habitats. Campers play games and have fun building mudflat castles, nature journaling, and crafts. Sailing Program Campers spend half their day exploring the diverse habitats of the Long Island Sound from land and the other half is spent on the water learning the fundamentals of basic sailing. Campers learn how to sail a small sailboat, learning basic boat rigging, handling and safety. The Junior Counselor Program is an opportunity for teens, 15 to 17 to gain volunteer hours, act as a positive role model and gain experience to working with youth. Junior Counselors assist with a group of campers, running games, exploring nature or teaching sailing.

Are you considering enrolling in a Wilderness School (WS) expedition? Then you have come to the right place! In this catalog, you will find a general description of the programs that WS is offering this summer. We invite you to explore and find which program best fits your goals and level of adventure.





Wilderness School is a positive youth development program for CT adolescents and young people ages 13-21 who are looking to make positive changes in their lives. Our expedition-based and "Challenge-by-Choice" 20-day, 14-day, 5-day, 3-day, and 1-day programs, led by trained outdoor professional staff, offer a variety of adventure activities that emphasize teamwork, communication, independence, and self-discovery in a techfree and supportive environment. Based on the course design, participants experience the following on their expeditions: hiking, backpacking, rock-climbing, canoeing, ropes/challenge course, service learning, and conservation/trail work. Our expeditions traditionally occur off basecamp on the CT/MA sections of the Appalachian Trail as well as along the regional Housatonic, Farmington, and Connecticut rivers.

Wilderness School also provides opportunities for "graduates" to continue their journey after completion of a summer course. We offer extended leadership expeditions for Alumni students during the summer as well as Follow-Up expeditions during the Fall, Winter, and Spring seasons. These courses dedicated towards strengthening relationships and staying connected with students and families. Alumni and Followareas include Uр course upstate Maine/Acadia National Park and the New York Adirondack Wilderness.



SHORT COURSE EXPEDITIONS

Our short courses range from 1-Day to 3-Days to 5-Days in length.

1-Day Programs

Participants are introduced to outdoor activities that incorporate elements of teambuilding, bonding, and cooperation. Activities may include hiking, canoeing, rock-climbing, or the ropes/challenge course. Programs are best suited for community groups, school groups, and Student/Agent/Family outings.

3-Day Expeditions

The primary focus of a 3-day is comfort and belonging. These courses are designed as an intro to Wilderness School programming. This is an excellent choice for young people new to an outdoor setting and overnight camping. Depending on the course design, activities may include hiking, canoeing, rock-climbing, or the ropes/challenge course. Often after completing a 3-day course, students elect to participate in longer courses later in the summer.

5-Day Expeditions

On a 5-day, students work to develop new skills and build resilience. These courses are designed around group travel by backpacking or canoeing (carrying all food, clothing, and equipment down the trail or waterway) for multiple days and overnight camping in different locations along the way. A high adventure activity such as the ropes/challenge course or rock-climbing is also incorporated into the course design. This is an excellent choice for young people who are ready to face a progressive challenge by expanding their comfort zones and building confidence and independence.



While on an extended overnight camping expedition, employed youth develop workforce skills as well as perform manual labor, alongside WS instructors, to maintain and construct trail networks in a designated area of the state. Enrichment activities include rock-climbing, canoeing, and team building. The extended duration of the course provides more opportunities for mastering skills, building resilience, and taking on leadership as the crew forms as a team.
